Editorial

This reference journal is published once a year and announces – in English language – most of the new publications in the field of cultural/social anthropology published in the German language area (Austria, Germany, Switzerland). Since many of these publications have been written in German, and most of them are not included in major, English language abstracting services, *Anthropological Abstracts (AA)* offers an opportunity and convenient source of information for scholars who do not read German, to become aware of anthropological research and publications in these countries. Included are journal articles, monographs, anthologies, exhibition catalogs, yearbooks, etc. Occasionally, publications in English, or French, are included as well if the publisher is less well-known internationally, and if it is likely that the publication will not be noticed abroad.

The present internet volume of *Anthropological Abstracts* (www.11) is also represented as Vol. 9.2010, published with Lit Publishers.

Some technical remarks

This reference journal uses a flexible approach in representing publications: While in usually abstracts are supplied, for *anthologies* the Current Contents method is applied, i.e. *only* authors and titles are printed. So technically, this is a combined approach: an Abstracting Reference Journal, and the Current Contents method of listing names and titles only. However, the complete material, including those papers which appear by title only, has been thoroughly indexed.

Abstracts supplied by authors are marked by ## before and after the abstract. Due to space limitations they may be abbreviated. Up to three editors of an anthology will be listed; if there are more, only the first will appear (added by *,et al.*).

Only those papers in journals will be abstracted that are relevant to cultural/social anthropology - which mainly applies in the case of interdisciplinary, or predominantly sociological journals. *AA* also tries to

cover subjects related to, or influencing, anthropology, i.e. if they are relevant for present discourses. Thus, there may be material from history, folklore studies, linguistics, sociology, philosophy, etc., if there is an intersection with present debates in anthropology.

Keywords serve as an "abstract of the abstract" - for a quick assessment of the contents. Page numbers in the Subject Index refer to the page where the *Keywords* listings appear.

Terms of the *Subject Index* – which is identical with the *Keywords* in alphabetical order – do not follow the Thesaurus principle but are chosen rather loosely and generously, according to need, and there is no strict formal rule to limit their number. In many cases, Subject Index terms try to be specific rather than general, in order to reduce the time of searching. Thus, if there is a topic relating to ,history', it will be specified like ,history (Guinea)', or ,history and literacy', so that users do not have to check all ,history' entries.

Regarding alphabetical order, the German Umlaut (ä, ö, ü) will be broken up into ae, oe, ue in the text, but is disregarded in the indexes.

The publishers, museums and research institutions must be thanked for their generally prompt deliveries of the books requested for *Anthropological Abstracts*.

##Transnational alternatives to migration beyond assimilation and acculturation. Transnational inclusion and hybrid cultural orders as conceptual alternatives to the assimilation and acculturation debate

Classic theories of migration describe international migration as one-way movements and investigate the cultural adjustment of migrants into a "majority society". Contrary to this view, the article raises the question of new, conceptual possibilities to describe migrants' assimilation and acculturation without conceptually focusing on a nation-state frame. In doing so, it makes reference to theories of transnational migration which define migration as a circular process connecting both sending and receiving contexts. This perspective enables, first, to analyze "structural assimilation" as multiple simultaneous inclusions of individuals into societal institutions in different nation-state locations. Secondly, it suggests to consider acculturation as a cultural adjustment of migrants' knowledge patterns, which goes hand in hand with the maintenance of cultural "otherness".##

Xenotopias. Locating alterity in the 19th century

Xenotopia is understood as analogous to Foucault's concept of heterotopia, as spaces where alterity is produced and stage-setted, which is particularly the case in museums and exhibitions, in the theater and in literature in the 19th century – which is presented to a mass audience. Their effects vary: As spaces of information mediation they aim at integrating alterity into existing patterns of order. But they are contact zones also, creating a framework for intercultural contact. The contributions by specialists of history, theater, dance, anthropology, history of art, literature show that xenotopias are not ,alien spaces' but spaces of the Other in the self.

The 22 papers of this reader by international (Wallerstein, Sklair, Sassen, Bhalla, Amartya Sen...) and German (Beck, Stichweh, Poferl, Berking, Römhild) authors (many of them sociologists), discuss this topic of suffering in a global perspective. The papers, empirical studies and theoretical concepts, deal with globalization and exclusion, spatial aspects of inequality, postnational models of membership, global justice, power and status in transnational spaces, migrants as avantgarde, gender and capitalism, risk society, or class analysis. Some argue for giving up the nationally limited perspective to be able to deal with worldwide claims for social participation and human rights.

Misrecognizing recognition. On identity and politics

Bedorf discusses three models, or theories, of recognition: intercultural (starting with multicultural diagnosis), intersubjectivist (spheres of interaction, ethics of primary reciprocity, cognitivism), and subjectifying recognition. The first two aims at relations between cultures/subjects, the third focuses on the generation of the subject itself. He further discusses – avoiding essentialism – identity as the integrating *telos* in these models, repeatedly utilizing Charles Taylor's "moral topography of the self". These discussions take place against the background of various minorities striving for recognition, respect and public visibility, and rights. Bedorf opines that there cannot be any "complete" recognition, and that, in processes of mutual recognition, these are necessarily processes of *mis*recognition.

##The Disagreeable System. Herbert Spencer's Work as a Prototype of Universal Theory

Unlike Marx, Durkheim, or Weber, sociology's collective memory does not hold Spencer in high esteem. His theory is presumed to propagate social Darwinism; and it seems to presuppose a teleological idea of progress and the acceptance of biological analogies. Less attention is paid to his historical role, his writings, and the cosmological character of his entire work. However, Spencer's philosophical system can be understood as an analytical ontology providing a catalogue of scientific topics. Contrary to monothetic diagnoses and methodological theories, it typifies an altogether different kind of universal theory, of which Luhmann's system theory would later be another instance. Since the work of Spencer marks the most universal and radical version of this theoretical type, to engage with Spencer means to address the issue of the possibility of universal theory and its functional equivalents. Such an engagement may help to make current debates over social theory more precise.##

##Cognitive anthropology and cognitive psychology: making use of synergies

Cognitive Anthropology and Cognitive Psychology are both empirical sciences that aim at contributing to a comprehensive picture of human reasoning and action by taking a cognitive perspective on cultural and psychological phenomena. However, the two disciplines take different angles on these topics with respect to content and methods. The position that a stronger integration of the two angles will provide desirable synergy effects is substantiated with regard to three aspects: the different methodologies (field studies vs. experiments), the often observed division of labour (analysis of culture-specific contents vs. analysis of general cognitive processes), and the cultural constitution of cognition. As such synergy effects will not emerge automatically, we discuss some implications for research practice resulting from the goal of a stronger cooperation between the two disciplines, and present some successful projects.##

##Anthropology - a supporting pillar in the cognitive science edifice?

Three decades ago, the cognitive sciences were established as the joint effort of six disciplines, united by the common goal of exploring the foundations of human cognition. Based already on twenty years of cognitive work, anthropology had become a supporting pillar in this interdisciplinary edifice that contributed to and benefited from the ongoing exchange of ideas, theoretical concepts, and methods. Since then, however, anthropology's presence and influence has continuously decreased - to the extent that it is now, and particularly so in the Germanspeaking areas, no longer even recognized as a potential partner in this interdisciplinary endeavor. This paper aims to make a case for changing this infelicitous situation. It exemplifies why cognitive approaches are still important for anthropology and why anthropology is indispensable for the cognitive sciences; it highlights some of the attempts that have been undertaken recently to improve the relationship; and finally, it tries to demonstrate why engaging in interdisciplinary cooperation is of mutual benefit.##

This handbook, edited by two philosophers, is organized by first presenting portraits of 15 important thinkers, half of them being philosophers but there are also Marcel Mauss, Lévi-Strauss, Geertz, and Foucault. The second part is organized according to approaches, from behaviorism to sociobiology and behavioral genetics – i.e. very broad categories not identical with cultural/social anthropological approaches proper. The subject section of the book has 41 topics which come closer to cultural/social anthropological perspectives, such as aggression, age, family, identity, power, morals, intoxication, language, sexuality, or *zoon politicon*.

##For an «embedded» sociology of high-risk organizations

Gaining access to high-risk organizations remains difficult but once achieved working in such an environment does not necessarily compel the researcher to create specific tools and techniques. More thought than is normal for the sociological method per se should, therefore, go into the conditions under which access is negotiated. In this article, we posit that a strategy similar to that adopted in developments in reporting, for this case dubbed «embedded journalism», is taking shape in sociology. Of course, an «embedded sociology» does not yet formally exist. Yet, the way in which sociologists have to approach high-risk environments leads us to apply the metaphor of «embeddedness» and to see the extent to which a comparison might be fruitful. On the one hand the strategy of embeddedness offers avenues for access to the private core of places, rarely the subject of sociological research. Social mechanisms and mechanismic explanation

##Researchers in all fields dealing with reality wish to explain facts once they have described them. The prevailing account of explanation in the philosophical literature is the "covering law model". According to this opinion, to explain a fact is to deduce the proposition(s) describing it from a theory together with the appropriate data, such as initial conditions. This is not how explanation is conceived of in the advanced factual sciences. In these, to explain a fact consists in unveiling the mechanism that makes the thing in question "tick". In turn, a mechanism consists in the process(es) characteristic of the given thing. For example, metabolism is the central mechanism of living beings, learning is that of schools, and trade that of markets. I call mechanismic this kind of explanation. Therefore, anyone wishing to control a concrete system had better start by finding out its typical mechanisms, so as to maintain or alter them. This is what social control mechanisms, from cooperation and charity to legislation and violence, are supposed to accomplish. Typically, social mechanisms involve at least two levels, micro (individual) and macro (institutional). Consequently they can be neither understood nor designed on the basis of either individualism or holism. I argue that only systemism, the view that every thing is either a system or a component of one, can satisfactorily account for the centrality of mechanisms. Warning: Merton, Giddens and others often called "structure" what I call "mechanism". Following mathematical usage, I define the structure of a system as the set of all the relations (in particular cohesive bonds) among the system component (endostructure), as well as the relations between the system components and things in the environment.##

I will therefore show in some detail what ramifications follow from combining figural speech and concept and how this effects the ANTarchitecture. Bringing concept and metaphor together on an operational level of description widens our scientific scope and enriches our perspective on social phenomena. Starting from the point of cognitive linguistics, the article discusses the peculiarities of metaphor and its problematic status in the scientific discourse. After some more general discussion of theories of metaphor, the text focuses on Bruno Latour's book "Reassembling the Social". Wrong or speculative "conspiracy theories" provide investigations within the sociology of knowledge with an important example of stigmatized knowledge. The proposition to interpret "speculation" as a third value that subverts the strictly binary (true/false) code of truth opens a theoretical framework for the analysis of the underlying process of stigmatization, claiming that the logical value of speculative statements is indeterminable. This characterization corresponds to a deep ambivalence: in contrast to proven falsity, speculation can maintain the hope of becoming true, but it stands in contrast to the established truth from which it diverges. The sociology of knowledge would profit from an analysis of the communicative conflicts about the conjectural limits of knowledge because these conflicts allow the study of the repression and marginalization of erroneous statements, which are involved in the production of knowledge of all sorts. The justification for this marginalization and exclusion is typically based on ontological arguments which describe methods of testing as external to the construction of knowledge. This presumption is revised by the constructionist perspective offered in this paper, and "empirical testing" is understood as a form of self-confirmation immanent within the process of the construction of knowledge.##

##Memorizing Violence and Coping with Pain: A Study of Refugees and Female Ex-fighters of TPLF in Several Different War Zones

This paper analyzes the interrelations between memory, violence and pain using several different case studies of refugees from Sudan, Chechenya, Somalia, and Cambodia. In addition, we analyze the case of female exflghters from the Ethiopian liberation movement TPLF. Our central questions concern the concepts and metaphors, which are used by the refugees and activists to express and remember experiences of violence. In this context, we discuss earlier concepts in the sociology of violence to assess their usefulness. Moreover, we examine Scarry's thesis (1992) that physical pain resists language. Specifically, we explore under which conditions this assumption can be refuted (or not). Finally, the "trauma" concept in these contexts is examined, taking into account that silence or speaking up can be a strategic choice in traumatic situations. In particular, we ask whether trauma remains an adequate concept understanding the complex experiences of violence and pain, and look at possible consequences of the trauma concept for identity constructions.##

The article discusses the development, meaning and theoretical context of both Robert Merton's concept of "opportunity structure" and the concept of "life-chances" that he took up from Max Weber. In order to analyze crucial social conflicts, I argue that both concepts should follow along the lines of conflict theory. While they converge in terms of meaning, we need different theoretical strategies to make their analytical and explanatory power explicit. First, a reinterpretation of the concept of opportunity structure shows that social actors might reduce others' access to options while realizing their own aims; second, life-chances should be put again in a Weberian perspective for two reasons. On the one hand Weber already conceptualizes them in the context of social struggles, on the other hand he shows that the mechanism of social closure helps to understand how people exclude others from life-chances by monopolizing resources.##

##The post-structural notion of the transitivity of knowledge implicates that empirical discourse analysis is involved in co-constructing of the reality it observes. In order to remain consistent with the acclaimed transitient nature of knowledge, discourse analysts should ensure that the discursive orders they observe are in line with their own discursivity. This article locates the possibility to assess the co-construction of social reality in the methodological position of constrained constructivism. Drawing on the French epistemological tradition of Gaston Bachelard, Georges Canguilhem, Pierre Bourdieu and Michel Foucault, and their late reception by Rainer Diaz-Bone, this article elucidates the methodological position of constrained constructivism. Constrained constructivism is seen to embrace four main features altogether: recognition of the ever present limits of cognition; attainment of an epistemological break from everyday knowledge; use of holistic methodology; and sustainment of second-order reflexivity. The concluding part of the article discusses the methodological consequences of constrained constructivism for discourse analysis. Amongst other things, decisions about the material analyzed, compilation of the text material, research strategies, and also the interpretations of the material should be justified and motivated with regard to the epistemological limits of research. Moreover, research results should be presented in such a transparent manner that they can be intersubjectively grasped, criticized and, ideally, also revised.##

This means that the principal patterns of our moral behaviour, the moral universals, are determined by our genetic outfit. Only the fine structure of our moral attitude is formed in the dialogue between the genetic software and the cultural meme. Along these lines we will analyze the concept of 'mixed strategies', exemplified among others by the political strategy of social market-economy', and the transition from morals to law in man's cultural history. ##Cognitive science research of religion

The purpose of this review paper is to discuss the relevance of cognitive science to the field of cultural anthropology with special emphasis on religious studies. Cognition as the mental capacity to represent and process information is a striking part of the mental apparatus. It is concerned with the manner in which people represent and interpret their natural, social and cultural environment. According to the standard model in the social sciences only socio-cultural factors could explain cultural and religious phenomena - its natural foundations, however, have been largely ignored

so far and mark the focus of the cognitive science of cultural studies. This contribution investigates functions of emotion in social interaction and their role in the emergence and reproduction of social structures and social order. It assumes that the elicitation of emotion is fundamentally dependent on the social environment and that emotions go hand in hand with characteristic action tendencies. On this basis, it is argued that the facial expression of emotion is particularly implicated in generating patterns of social action and interaction. First, it is shown that the encoding of facial expression combines hard-wired physiological principles on the one hand and socially learned aspects on the other, leading to more fine-grained and socially differentiated "dialects" of emotional expression. Second, it is argued that the decoding of facial expression is contingent upon this combination, so that reciprocal attributions of emotional states, situational interpretations, and action tendencies are more effective within rather than across social units. Third, this conjunction affects the conditions for emotional contagion, which is shown to be more effective within social units exhibiting similar encoding and decoding charactelistics and thus aligns emotions and action tendencies in a coherent, yet socially differentiated fashion. Taken together, these interactional processes show that emotions facilitate the structuring of social interaction and the emergence of social order##

Following a brief reconstruction of key modernization theoretical premises against which this claim is directed, it compares the five largest Western countries with the currently most advanced exemplars of East Asian modernity. The findings show that the two regions are remarkably similar in virtually all respects that matter from a modernization theoretical viewpoint. The article then goes on to assess the relevance of the evidence held against modernization theory by Eisenstadt and his followers. As it turns out, this evidence presents no challenge modernization theory whatsoever. Moreover, its to epistemological status is dubious given that multiple modernists lack a sufficiently worked-out theory of modernity in whose light the social theoretic significance of empirical observations could be assessed. Drawing upon the differentiation theoretical tradition, an alternative approach is outlined that addresses multiple modernists' substantive concerns without falling into the trap of essentializing diversity. ##Against the backdrop of current research on the city, urbanity is understood to be a distinct way of life in which (in the spatial, factual and historical dimensions) processes of densification and heterogenization are perceived as acts of sociation. Urbanization is thus understood to include and produce structuration processes autonomously; this also includes autonomous linguistic practices, which are reflected as sediments of everyday knowledge in language and thus create the instruments needed

for facilitating and generalizing such urbanization: urban languages. In this conceptual context, which looks at cities in Africa from the point of view of language sociology, two large phases of urbanization can be distinguished in Africa. The first phase is related to trade networks and cultural *métissage* of small groups of middlemen. The second phase, characterized by efforts to deal with Africa's colonial history and to catch up with "the world", presses ahead with the development of an autonomous, authentic modernity. The reconstruction of the development undergone especially by the more recent urban languages raises questions about the connotations of urbanization and modernization in contemporary Africa: on the one hand, dissociation from colonial legacies as well as from the postcolonial political elites, impotent administrations, and tribalist instrumentalizations of language and language policies; on the other, quite the reverse - the creation of autonomous African modernities that include the city (and the state), brought about by the interplay of both local dynamics and global flows.##

##"How are ideas about the tourist-destination Morocco produced and communicated to the visitors?", we asked in a research project funded by Deutsche Forschungsgemeinschaft (DFG). Based on fieldwork and empirical studies in Morocco, our focus was on contributing to a theory of this particular form of transcultural communication. We considered applying visual research methods and presenting findings in cinematographic form essential for studies in the image-based field of tourism.

Besides texts we prepared cinematographic documentaries for publication. The film L'Art du Désert as discussed in this paper is Just a first step on the way exploring the scientific potenzial of visual media. Can images be used to communicate theoretical insights? To allow for discussion of this question and to further develop methodological strategies we decided to present our preliminary results.

In non-abstract images our video-material shows processes of communicating culture in Morocco. We see how those who offer services in tourism interact with their clients. Editing the takes in particular ways allows us to unveil specific patterns of behaviour. Juxtaposing images becomes a method of analysis. Cuts introduce meaning. Statements are made with the techniques of montage. In a non-verbal way we get insight into the principles that guide the phenomena. And that is precicely our understanding of what is a theory: giving insight into the principles behind phenomena. So theory is expressed in a purely visual form.##

Here, I have placed emphasis on "quality", currency or popularity and personal knowledge and interest, i.e. I have selected from my collection those proverbs that I think are well formulated, popular or addressing current and historical issues which appeal to me most and which might also appeal to my readers. It should, however, be said here and now that I do not know all Dàgàrà proverbs and their variants in the different dialects. Thus, I cannot claim that I have collected all the most popular or suitable ones for the purpose of this book. Over the years, I have subjected them to constant examination and revision in order to achieve an accurate version of each proverb, to account for different varieties of the same proverb either in one and the same Dàgàrà dialect or from cross-dialect perspectives on form and content. I have also tried to avoid or to eliminate extraneous data but have exercised no deliberate censorship.## The order of the book is: a rather theoretical 15-page preface dealing with types of proverbs, questions of definition, pre-sent stage of research, selection and follows an introduction (chapter arrangement. It 1) discussing geographical aspects, historical background, cultural attitudes and ,realms' (such as religion, food, education, respect, gender...), and the 2nd chapter deals with literary and linguistic aspects. The corpus of proverbs has translations into four, sometimes five languages (the fifth being Latin). The second part of the book groups and discusses the proverbs according to area of life (like: activity, destiny, eating, family, human nature, human relations...), i.e. in contexts.

Nigeria is the biggest ,Christian-Islamic' state in the world and simultaneously the most densely populated part of Africa, and Nigerians are the biggest African overseas diaspora. The state has enormous oil and gas reserves. Since 1960 there are attempts to establish a nation – on the basis of this ethnically and religiously highly complex setting – after about a dozen military *coups d'état*. In this process, the Biafra War serves as an implict state doctrine for the elites – to avoid a comparable conflict at all costs. This setting, plus the aim to equally distribute the income accruing from oil and gas among themselves, serves as ideological ,doctrines' and framework for the elites of this state. Chapters deal with a discussion of the wealth of resources in the state, the Biafra War, the multiethnic state, new and old alliances, and new developments which complicate the situation and make it more intransparent.

This book is based on field research in Assin Endwa and Kumasi (p.91). Bochow first discusses intimacy in pre-marital relations, its concepts and contexts, in Africa generally, and in Akan societies. The next part comprises the fieldwork during which she has focused on the Valentine's Day, in schools and the universities there, and Part III is devoted to discussing the time before marriage in the context of pentecostal churches: planning marriage and plans for professional achievement of young urban people. Here, Bochow focuses on marriage, change and renewal in pentecostal preaching and church practice – how young people prepare for marriage etc. The discussion deals with ,globalized love' in pentecostal discourse, and in the end Bochow summarized her fieldwork insights regarding love, intimacy, and marriage.

Desplat's study, based on fieldwork, asks how sacredness in a certain place and time affects present-day society – exemplified in Harar – and how it interacts with "global flows" of Islamic reform processes. The author analyzes the dynamic relation between public discourses of religious practice and societal change. He shows how the debate on sacredness in Islam not only represents a controversy on theological issues but a competitive battle between social groups way beyond the local setting of sacredness, and the culturalization of religious practices and sacred places is a central facet of this dispute. Thus, the present study deals with a general problem of anthropologically inspired research on Islam: Is it possible to explain the heterogeneous lifeworlds of various Muslim societies with the claim and dogmatics of a universalist Islam? In this context, discussions about sacredness are representative here, because they are situated exactly at the interface between a local Islam on the one hand and the need for universal validity on the other hand. Desplat's book is a contribution to studies on Muslim societies in Africa, on the ethnography of Ethiopia and the relations between religious practices, local power structures, and translocal networks.

##Among the Bashada of Southern Ethiopia, individual misdeeds and wrong-doings are expected, especially when it comes to children and adolescents, as it is believed that misbehaviour is part of human nature. To prevent them from harming themselves and others, children, adolescents and adults have to be guarded, and guided, and also sanctioned by their age-mates and seniors. As unresolved conflicts are believed to bring about misfortune and cause disasters such as warfare, sickness or droughts, disturbed social relations are usually mended through social sanctions.

In her research Susanne Epple examines the specific social roles individuals achieve or are ascribed to during their lives. She looks at the specific modes of communication used to articulate, confirm and strengthen social relations between children, adolescents, adults and elderly people of both sexes. In this context, she shows that the existing age-set organisation has an influence on all members of Bashada society. While the relationships between adult men as members of the different age-sets are clearly defined and interaction between them follows certain rules, the relations among children, adolescents and women follow the principle of seniority in a more general way. Besides giving a close insight into Bashada lives, Epple offers a new perspective on East African age-set societies.##

Based on fieldwork in Benin, Burkina Faso, Mali, and Ghana between 1998-2003 the author discusses mainly the social and cultural situations of gold digging in these regions – social relationships emerging around this work, and how they are related to the major strategies of accumulation of these actors, which partly shows in the inclusion of strangers and the exclusion of members of the community. Another level is the interaction and everyday practice of the diggers vis-à-vis governmental and control institutions, the health dimension, social security, religious practice. The first chapter is about local contexts of gold digging in Northern Benin, then the labor organization of gold digging in the Atakora hills, juridical and political contexts, life worlds and forms of social integration, change and life histories after the gold boom in Northern Benin, and a comparison

of similarities and differences of case studies. In theoretically assessing these people the author finds the the notion of *frontier* useful, showing the openness of social arrangements in constituting these communities, as well as the slow solidification of social roles, structures, and norms.

##Although throughout the history of anthropology the ethnography of urban societies was never an important topic, investigations on cities in Africa contributed to the early theoretical development of urban studies in social sciences. As the ethnography of rural migrants in towns made clear, cultural diversity and creativity are foundational and permanent elements of urban cultures in Africa (and beyond). Currently, two new aspects complement these insights: 1) Different forms of mobility have received a new awareness through the concept of transnationalism. They are much more complex, including not only rural-urban migration, but also urbanurban migration, and migrations with a destination beyond the continent. 2) Urban life-worlds also include the appropriation of globally circulating images and lifestyles, which contribute substantially to the current cultural dynamics of cities in Africa. These two aspects are the reasons for the high complexity of urban contexts in Africa. Therefore, whether it is still appropriate to speak about the "locality" of these life-worlds has become questionable. Chapters discuss poverty, gender relations and Aids in Tanzania, the town of Pangani is described, the notion of local life-worlds, schools, orphans and their care, life-words of HIV-positive women and their children, and finally, social reproduction in the times of Aids.

The article tries to give an overview of the main research findings with its main concern being the development of the so-called "African style" as a result of a popular cultural movement instigated by women. They embody broader essential cultural, moral and social values incorporated by women. Furthermore, the processes of globalization have introduced significant changes with the tremendous quantities of textile imports from Asia and the intensified mediation of prestigious images of world fashion, western lifestyles, and role models of femininity. Surprisingly, Abidjan still turns out to be a thriving city with a highly dynamic fashion sector whose trends and styles have won highest esteem in countries all over West and Central Africa. This study has two aims: On the one hand, it looks into the organization of production and circulation of fashion to get a better understanding of the local technical and material constraints and opportunities which prevail in this specific city. Maurer uses qualitative and quantitative data (applying sociological triangulation) – interviews, media information of various kinds. So she first presents her methodology, then the Samburu and their social structure, tourism in Kenya, then the book and following it the film. The next section deals with analysis and interpretation – the ,power of images', Africa as a ,dangerous continent', ,black men' and sex, and analysis of reactions to the movie – sequence analyses of the contents/contexts/parts of the film. In this way ,floor crossings' between cultures are described, transcultural encounters, multiculturality – how this actually takes place in the behavior of human beings.

Alternatively, this paper pleads for an actor-centered and historically informed understanding of change and continuity.##

As the epistemological interest lies more on the people who stay rather than those who flee, in the second part the paper argues that the practice of routinization indicates a conscious tactic whose purpose is to counter the non-declared state of exception in Goma. Routinization is defined as a means of establishing order in everyday life by referring to narratives based on lived experiences.##

Tribal land in this area increasingly becomes a marketable commodity even though it is prohibited by juridical regulations. Neither the government nor state institutions are able to prevent such transactions. Simultaneously, local concepts of preventing disaster and suffering clearly limit the selling and other utilization of certain kinds of tribal land. The study, based on fieldwork, includes traditional views of various influences on the land where one lives, such as the negative influence of sexual intercourse other than of the couple living there in a house; it would create misfortune. Case descriptions and statements of informants add a dialogic dimension to the study. Despite increased selling of land certain kinds are not sold: inherited land and land that has been ritually ,impregnated' against sorcery.

Metal analysis of figurine brass objects from Benin at the Ethnological Museum, Berlin

##A series of 56 bronze statuettes from Benin has been analysed by a emission spectrography and atomic absorption spectrometry. Since from already published analyses of memorial heads and relief plates it is obvious that there is clear relation between the composition of a brass object from Benin and its date of manufacture, there was a considerable interest to check whether the alloys used for the statuettes fit into this already established system.

The metal analysis of the statuettes showed that most of them have been made from a brass with very high amounts of zinc, which is a feature of products of the later phases of manufacture. But there are too some statuettes made of bronze or of a brass with low concentrations of zinc, characteristic for early objects. Besides the high concentration of zinc there are further arguments of a late production, like the high concentration of cadmium or the decrease of trace element concentrations, first of all of nickel and antimony.

With respect to characteristic features defined groups of statuettes, altar groups are rich in zinc, while statuettes of dignitaries contain less zinc. Among the statuettes of animals, those rich in zinc are frequent, but always there are a few examples with low concentrations of zinc, indicating an earlier origin.##

This fruit, the Karité nut is harvested and processed by women and is used for cosmetic and therapeutic purposes and in the food industry. Schäfer frames her topic with Bourdieu's theory of practice (fields of practices of development and transnational interaction) and Foucault's discourse analysis is utilized by analyzing legitimizing ascriptions, justifications and discourses for development – all of these are visible in the practices of the actors. Finally, repercussions of this process of ,internationalization' of this product are traced back in the local field. The study is based on fieldwork and there are 24 persons interviewed.

Sankofa has become a key reference for a positive interpretation of the past and an appreciation of tradition and it is consequently appropriated aesthetically as well as politically - both in a national as well as increasingly in an Africandiasporic context. However, in diasporic understandings, Sankofa refers to yet another past, namely, to the complex history of slavery, which is connected to the question of black identity and belonging. The article traces these diverse appropriations in political, religious, cultural and consumption-oriented spheres. It asks about the specific connections that are drawn between past, present and future and seeks to understand the various notions of history and historical consciousness that go along with different understandings of national as well as black identity. These questions are discussed with reference to Haile Gerima's film "Sankofa" as well as to recentp developments in Ghanaian cultural politics and tourism.##

##This article explores the significance of amateur football for the changing patterns of circular migration in post-Apartheid South Africa. The state-institutionalised system has merely been replaced by an informal system of translocal livelihood organisation. The new system fundamentally relies on social networks and complex rural-urban linkages. Mobile ways of life have evolved that can be classified as neither rural nor urban. Looking into these informal linkages can contribute to explaining the persistence of spatial and social disparities in "New South Africa". This paper centres on

an empirical, bi-local case study that traces the genesis of the socio-spatial linkages between a village in former Transkei and an informal settlement in Cape Town. The focus is on the relevance of football for the emergence and stabilisation of translocal network structures.##

##When considering urban indigenous people in Chile, attention is paid mostly to those living in the capital, Santiago de Chile, where nearly half of the indigenous population lives. The new ethnonym Warriache has been developed in order to denominate the urban Mapuche. Even so, there are many indigenous people, mainly Mapuche, living in the southern cities of Concepción, Temuco or Puerto Montt, who have been disregarded as such until recently. In my article I focus on the communication of ethnicity in the city of Temuco by means of food and poetics. Both aspects may be useful in describing the differences between the situations of urban people in the capital and the south, and in considering the significance of rural indigenous culture.##

BJERREGAARD, LENA Pre-Colombian hairnets in the Museum of Ethnology, Berlin Baessler-Archiv 58.2010:39-51 Keywords: hairnets, pre-Colombian hairnets, museology

##The Museum of Ethnology in Berlin has a collection of very delicate plant fiber hairnets. According to this study, they were made on the Central coast of Peru to around 14-16th century, and were used by both male and female weavers (although maybe not exclusively). A few of the nets are of camelid fiber but most are made of fine plan fiber yarns – i.e. *Furcraea Andina* (related to Agave). Most of the nets have intricate knotted patterns made in technique somewhat similar to *tatting*. About one third of the nets are painted with shellfish purple and a few with Indigo – mixed with a binding media. The nets are almost all from Pachamac, and they entered the museum in the beginning of the 20th century.##

##Middle Horizon Tocapus arranged in disconnected rows: Headdress M 32205 of the Linden-Museum, Stuttgart

A feathered bi-convex headdress of unknown provenance in the Linden-Museum, Stuttgart, likely dates to the Middle Horizon based on an analysis of its central motif. This paper examines iconographic representations from different time periods to provide a relative date for the Stuttgart artifact and to clarify its original function. Special attention is given to the meaning of the central motif, which might be derived from realistically represented depictions or codified representations of Middle Horizon tocapus.

The headdress is covered with tiny feathers of turquoise, orange, and black on a yellow background. The feathers come from the throat of the Paradise Tanager, as well as from multiple species of parrots, and were attached to the fabric after the weaving was completed. Three horizontal rows of dicelike motifs decorate the headdress. The central motif consists of a square with four dots in that is repeated in three different color combinations around the headdress (Fig. 1).

The headdress originally might have been part of the artificial head of a mummy bundle similar to South Coast examples that are still preserved. Bi-convex headdresses are very common in Wari and Tiwanaku cultures, but also are seen on Nasca ceramics (Fig. 3) and according to Heidi King (personal communication), on Late Moche ceramics as well. Tiwanaku IV phase portrait vases and Wari stone and metal figurines (Pikillaqta) each show highly ranked men with this particular type of headdress (Figs. 2 and 4). Patricia Knobloch suggests that "[... I these particular depictions represent agents belonging to the Tiwanaku social sphere [...] ".

The central motif of the headdress, a square with four dots, also is found on a Middle Horizon 2A effigy vessel from the Denver Art Museum. In this case, the motif is combined with trophy heads (Fig. 5). Other closelyrelated motifs include diagonal double motifs with two rings (Figs. 6 and 7) and four dots (Figs. 8 and 9).##

Hence, the pretext is a chapter on Spanish mission, its history, partly of atrocities, and their theological counsel (e.g. on sexuality, the devil, afterlife...). Most of the book is devoted to "Aymarà cosmovision", their view of the human being, space and time, levels of the cosmos, agrarian and cyclical rituals and their specialists, life-cycle and healing rites, and rituals in the contested field between indigenous religion and Christian demands. In some cases (cosmovision of Aymarà and Spaniards, goddesses: Pachamama and Mary) the author attempts comparisons. The final chapter deals with rituals of death and afterlife.

Kammler describes the interrelationships of cultural change with religious affiliations among three neighboring and variously structured village
communities in the Mexican state of Guerrero. The focus is on the fact that although the three share similar general conditions of existence and similar cultural heritage, they nevertheless show different ways in designing their own modernity. Kammler asks if certain processes of change, such as decisions for or against a religious conversion, can be traced to local life practice which includes border-crossing migration. Religious fragmentation is taken as a sign that the traditional reservoir of collective convictions, i.e. a common myth as a source of meaning in life, is not sufficient any more to deal with problems of an accelerated cultural change.

Lamberg inquires into the influence liberalization has on agriculture, coming from the WTO, or as a result of the ratification of the Central American Free Trade Zone treaty. She confronts this development with detailed description of realities of life of the indigenous *comunidades* living in the autonomous areas of the country, and who apply subsistence forms of production – asking whether this subsistence-oriented economy can be a realistic alternative to "development" measures, or whether this may be ,social romanticism'. Lamberg describes the historical and political background, and for her fieldwork in 2007 uses a mix of qualitative social science research (document analysis), semi-structured interviews, and participant observation. The last chapter includes details about the Región Autónoma del Atlántico Norte.

Statistical event history analysis is used to show that the adoption and diffusion of state lotteries depends on fiscal, political, and regional factors of competition as well as on normative factors of social legitimization. Two further arguments are developed, discussing, for one, an advanced model of regional diffusion that views the regional effect as dependent on the ideological-institutional context and, secondly, analyzing time dynamics in the diffusion process to show how initial explanatory factors change over time. In general, the findings indicate that the institutional environment shapes the diffusion of organizations.##

foodways were not tribal or "ethnic" but part of a broader culinary pattern or regional cuisine. Although structurally simple, they were more varied than commonly acknowledged. Everyday dishes were differentiated from festive ones, but a culinary differentiation into "high" and "low" cuisine was unknown. Some foreign foodstuffs crossed the culinary frontier and were incorporated into native foodways. But no fusion food or crossover cuisine emerged. Only with the adoption of sugar, tea, coffee, and chocolate culinary stratification did start. I call these experiences of sensual perception enchanted perception ("beGeisterte Wahrnehmung"). They are lived and treated as such caused by spirits, who transmit truthful and meaningful messages. This occurs due to the influence of Afro-Cuban religions on the social conception of reality. The concept of médium unidad represents a socially constructed practice of perception, which exhibits an alternative to the usual treatment of comparable phenomena in western-scientific contexts. Especially in psychiatry they are classified in general terms as psychopathologies. This articles examines the treatment of these phenomena in Cuban society using spiritistic women's life histories in Havana.##

Alex presents a medical anthropological approach on healing systems and traditions, medical care structures and concepts of health and illness in Tamil Nadu. It is an introductory book using case studies by adopting the emic perspective of subaltern groups on these health systems of rural Tamil Nadu, and by relating them to indigenous concepts and categories of health and illness. This includes non-formalized healing practices which are not represented in official statistics regarding health. This ethnographic part serves as context for the analytical part which aims to contextualize and analyze the valuation and acceptance of the various health care opportunities in rural Tamil Nadu, based on quantitative and qualitative data. The chapters introduce the castes involved (Vagri, Mutturaja, Paraiyar), theoretical issues of medical anthropological perspectives, the health system in India and concepts of health and illness in Tamil Nadu (i.e., Tamilian notions, a typology of causes). This is followed by a description of the ,medical landscape': governmental and nongovernmental institutions, pharmacies, folk medicine, pujaris, and various specialized healers. The next chapter is devoted to the professionalization of traditional medicine connected with the Vagri. Ten brief case studies discuss the health seeking behavior of individuals, and the last chapter evaluates preference of the various institutions/healers frequented, based interviews. The appendix contains questionnaires, on diagrams. photograph, a glossary, etc.

##Is democracy in crisis in Southeast Asia?

The article gives an overview over the status of democratization in southeast Asia by looking at established democracy indices such as the Freedom House data and Bertelsmann Transformation Index. After mapping the regime types of Southeast Asian states, the article analyses the state of consolidation in southeast Asia's young democracies with Linz/Stepan's model of democratic consolidation. The article shows that democracy has received serious setbacks only in Thailand (and to a certain extent also in the Philippines), whereas Indonesia's democracy has gained maturity in recent years. These developments are reflected in constitutional consolidation, political party development and the reform of the militaries of the region. The prospects for democratization are quite gloomy, since most of the authoritarian regimes in the region lack the conditions considered conducive for democratization, such as economic development, a vivid and active middle class or vigorous working class. External do influences also favour the status quo and not support democratization.##

This article analyses Siam's position within the international law structure in the early twentieth century, when the issue arose it also reminds the reader of a tradition in international law theory which does not consider international law and municipal law as essentially different, and on this basis it then suggests that there is a regional (Buddhist) customary law and regional principles in Thailand and the surrounding regions of Southeast Asia that could profitably have been considered by the International Court of Justice.##

##Devatās of Himachal Pradesh. North Indian metal works in the Linden-Museum Stuttgart

The Linden-Museum Stuttgart owns a very impressive collection of masks of Himachal Pradesh. These are called *devatās* or *mohrās*. The mohrās are normally fixed in groups upon a palanquin (*ratha*) and are kept in their own shrines. For certain festivals they are carried across the mountains and bow to each other on the *maidān* (place for festivals). The *mohrās* of the Linden-Museum can be identified as Śiva, Devī and a snake-deity (*nāga*). One of the masks could be regarded as Narasimha.

Exceptional is a votive plaque of the *trimūrti* Brahmā, Viṣṇu and Śiva. Viṣṇus mace is here interpreted as a spear which is typical for the region south of the Sutlej. Very unusual is the lion throne (siṃhāsana)Viṣṇu is placed on. This is most likely a local syncretism as the lion is a symbol of a sovereign and the Śākya clan into which the Buddha was born. In the Western Himalayas we can find Buddha Śākyamuni, Mañjuśrī, Tathāgata Vairocana and even Gaņeśa seated on a lion throne. Also the peacocks might represent the symbolic animals of the Tathāgata Amithāba since Vajrayāna Buddhism is practised in the surrounding areas.##

FERDIN, MARIUS, STEFAN GÖRLITZ & STEFFEN SCHWÖRER Water Stress in the Cauvery Basin, South India - How current water management approaches and allocation conflict constrain reform ASIEN 117.2010:27-44

##This article presents insights on the state of water management in the Cauvery basin in South India and the ongoing interstate dispute concerning the allocation of the Cauvery's water between the riparian states Karnataka and Tamil Nadu. A lack of multi-level, intersectoral, and participative approaches on the one hand have led to inadequate conditions in water management and water use. On the other hand, the conflict between the two states on water allocation cannot be resolved due to strong reluctance and non-compliance by the states and a highly politicized debate. We identify some clear correlations between inadequate internal water management at the state level and the interstate dispute: the ongoing conflict constraining modernization of the system in the basin is used to justify-non-action in irrigation-management reform and ties up state resources as well. Additionally, the current water-management approach does not provide for a mechanism to address the concerns and demands of stakeholders, nor does it promote dialogue between them.##

Structure and decor – The development of the serpent motif in Orissa sacred architecture Tribus 59.2010:192-201

##From Nepal's omnipresent Viṣṇu reclined on the coils of Śeṣa, who represents the primeval waters, down to Sri Lanka's beautiful nāga stelae and Nāgarājas, that are the foremost guardstones of Buddhist Stūpas (dagoba), the serpent motif is of utmost importance in the whole South Asian realm.

Nowhere, however, more impressive than in Orissa the nāga motif forms a structural type of embellishment of both Hindu temples and Buddhist monasteries. More often than not it appears in the vertical recesses of walls. Earlier, the nāgas and nāgīs, each encircling his or her respective pilaster, erect their anthropomorphic busts on the lower parts of the shafts, while their tails elegantly climb upwards (exempli gratia Mukteśvara). Later, their movement is turned, caused by aesthetic reasons, as it seems (exempli gratia Rājrānī).

The finest blossom of nāga decor is represented by the great sun temple of Koņārka. The nāgas now form erotic couples, entwined, each pair encircling only one pilaster. Finally even the amount of Nāgas on one pilaster is enlarged up to six creatures, anthropomorphic and zoomorphic shapes artistically mixed.##

##Taking the current situation characterised by the defeat of the Liberation Tigers of Tamil Eelam (LTTE) by the Sri Lankan military forces in May 2009 as a starting point, this article looks into the potential prospects for peace. The main part is based on an empirical case study conducted in the northern peninsula of Jaffna, where the LTTE lost their stronghold in the mid-1990s. The subsequent occupation of Jaffna by the Sri Lankan military forms the point of departure for an analysis of reconstruction and development efforts after the cease fire of 2002. Based on a detailed analysis of shifting gender relations this article argues first that the interrelatedness of gendered and ethnic relations with regard to the construction of local "culture" produces meaningful markers for demarcation. The second focus relates to local perspectives on the state as an actor in development and reconstruction. The article highlights that local actors' negotiating of the potential role of both the state and the LTTE are ambivalent and embedded in constructions of sameness and difference. The article concludes by shedding light on recent developments and Sri Lanka's future perspectives.##

##This article analyses the development of civil society in Malaysia under competitive-authoritarian rule. Applying the concept of historical institutionalism, institutional legacies will be identified which have been and still are of great influence on the structures and functions of Malaysian civil society. The study shows that civil society changed profoundly since 1957, with regard to its structures and functionalities. An ethnically segmented civil society, based on religious, cultural and functional interest groups, has been replaced by a civil society which is built upon NGos and social movements which are well-connected with other opposition actors. The article argues that civil society groups are increasingly emerging as challengers for the autocratic elites. Nevertheless, by using coercion and co-opting parts of the opposition, the autocratic elites continue to keep the civil society in check in order to stabilize their autocratic rule. However, the use of coercion and cooptation is restricted due to the regime's competitive character, thus producing a structural, functional and operative limited civil society.##

He finds fundamentalist driving forces and ideologies in Hindu nationalists aiming at the separation of otherness, and he interprets the Hindu nationalists' attempts to press indigenous tradition into the framework of the national idea as an adaptation of western nationalists and social darwinists of the 19th century. The chapters discuss the question of the clash of civilizations' in relation to the critical method of an intercultural philosophy, Kant and the complex of morals, then Indian history and ,fatalism', traits of fatalism in the Mahābhārata – and the Bhagavadgītā, followed by the question of whether Krsna's fight in this text might be a ,Djihad'. ##The German India-Expedition 1955-58, lead-managed by Gustav Adolf Baron of Maydell, was probably the last "universal" collecting expedition which started from Hamburg, namely by order of the Zoological Institute and Museum. The main focus of the expedition was on the field of zoology, botany and ethnology. Baron of Maydell collected scientific material for quite a number of further museums, institutes and scientists within and outside Hamburg and here especially for the Zoological Garden, Wuppertal, the Linden-Museum, Stuttgart, and the Overseas Museum, Bremen.

In the field of ethnology mainly articles of daily and commercial use should be collected. Even though the ethnological yield purely quantitatively did not come up to the zoological and botanical, the expedition collected altogether 233 ethnological objects of daily, commercial and cultic use (from still very aboriginal ethnic groups, especially the Gonds and Garos) which were distributed among three wellknown museums. The highlight of the ethnological collection turned out to be the Jaina altar which was turned over to the Linden-Museum.##

At the same time, terrorists involved in the bombings in Europe since 20021 regularly visited mosques associated with these movements, especially the Tablīghī Jamā'at. The "Islamic project" of the three movements is the "Sunnaization" – that is, the reshaping and reconstruction - of the daily routine and the individual markers of identity based on the examples of the Prophet and the Salaf (the pious ancestors) as portrayed in the Hadīth literature. This so-called "apolitical" Sunnaization can be understood as the privatization or individualization of political re-Islamization.##

When the concept was introduced to China by western companies and international organizations in the 1990s, the Chinese government at first regarded CSR as a hindrance to its national economy. Only recently did

the government start to apply the concept for domestic as well as international purposes. This paper analyses the introduction of CSR to an industry highly affected by the concept's emergence - namely the Chinese textile and apparel industry. Apart from laying bare how CSR is applied in the Chinese context, the paper explains how the concept is integrated into the industry's restructuring process and how the Chinese government is attempting to handle the challenge of poor working conditions in the industry by passing the problem on to the private sector and the society. This book explores the impacts regional autonomy had on the well-being of the Dayak Benuaq - one of the diverse indigenous groups of East Kalimantan. It describes the Dayak Benuaq's own perceptions of poverty and well-being, documents processes of ongoing social, political and economic change, and demonstrates how they are intertwined with decentralisation. The ethnographic case studies of three Dayak Benuaq villages show that decentralization is not - as often assumed automatically pro poor. Instead, it is the respective bargaining power of local actors which determines the outcomes of decentralisation. The Hindu-Balinese notion of three human qualities called triguna serves as an interpretive framework for categorizing the musical repertoire according to both widespread religious knowledge and more esoteric wisdom.## The first part describes origins and ownership of orchestras in five districts, the second the repertoire which makes a discussion of the guna concept necessary. This paper focuses on Shiba's legacy, especially his late essays on a number of aspects of Japanese modern history and various cycles of historical development. His critical views about Japan's severe financial crisis during the bursting of the so-called "bubble economy" are also included. At the end of his life, Shiba tended to be rather pessimistic about the future of his country. Looking back from today by quoting several comments by some of Shiba's most concerned readers also helps us get a better understanding of the present status of public opinion in Japan.##

This is a detailed ethnography of the merchant caste population of Agravāls living in a market town of the Himalayan foothills in Kumaon, and it is a problem-oriented study of "Puritanism". History, mythology (three foundational texts are translated from Hindi), and major cultural traits of this caste/jāti (rituals, festivals, exchange, economy, social control, segregation, purity/impurity...) are presented, based on fieldwork (1995/96) and on textual sources. It is a problem-oriented study as well, inquiring whether there is a so-called "puritanical" lifestyle in this caste, as has been claimed for "higher" Hindu castes in general by numerous authors. These authors are presented in detail (Carstairs, Srinivas, Manisha Roy, A. Bharati, A. Jha...), and theoretical models of "Puritanism" other than historical Puritanism are presented (E. Gellner, Waardenburg...). Cultural contents of historical Puritanism are analyzed first as a basis to deal with behavior in the case of the Agravāls in a second step.

Hence, in the field situation, the concept of purity, based on textual concepts of guna and its present occurance in belief and behavior is dealt with, which coincides with the work of McKim Marriott. Then, 19 cases or instances of what may be understood as "puritanical" behavior are described and analyzed against the theoretical background, and culturalbiographical sketches of a number of persons of this caste are included throughout the study. Altogether, roughly fifty families have been researched, amounting to 94 individual persons, including 28 women. Results show that there is behavior and belief among some persons, comparable to what may be called ", puritanical", but motivations (ethics) and "mechanics" of such behavior differ significantly from that of historical Puritans as described by Max Weber and others: Motivation, or theology inspiring such behavior is of a different kind. Another result is a "devaluation" of the assumption of a kind of homogeneous group identity of this caste – instead, individual and family-dominated identity has been found. This agrees with a theoretical trend departing from seeing castes as homogeneous units, and with an increasing focus on persons in anthropological studies.

##Plural world interpretations and transdifference: Models of dominance and interaction in everyday practice of the West Tyvans in South Siberia This article analyses the flexible way of handling plural models of world interpretation in West Tyvan daily practice. Based on fieldwork in the Republic of Tyva (Russian Federation) in 2004/2005, it is part of a research project that led to a dissertation submitted to Leipzig University in 2010. At least two models of world interpretation were identified. Both exist as realities of equal value but can structurally be differentiated as "model of dominance" and "model of interaction." The first stresses the human dominance over the environment, seen as a series of more or less passive objects of human agency," the second emphasizes the "Interaction in a world enclosing humans and consisting of both human and non-human subjects." Both models are coherent systems and belong in equal degree to the repertoire of knowledge, behaviour and acting of West Tyvan agents. To them, these models count as equal and mutually contradictory. The models compete and oppose each other, but form a continuum within a single person to the effect that the human agent is constantly positioning himself, depending on situation and context. The empirical material demonstrates that West Tyvans use these models in various ways replacing, complementing and mixing them according to their needs in specific contexts.##

##The 1970s and the 1980s saw a great surge in the protest movement in the Republic of Korea. In its course student activists and intellectuals unexpectedly turned to traditional culture as their source of inspiration. Folk culture, for example shamanism, long considered a distant relic of the past, found a new focus. This paper addresses one question in particular: how an old religious culture, which had been suppressed as "superstitious" in the public sphere, resurfaced through the protest movement. In this context two aspects are examined based on writings from this period: what implications did shamanism hold for those in protest circles; and what function did this belief system perform for the protest movement. It is shown that three distinctive features of shamanism were brought into prominence in the literature examined. In the final analysis it is argued that the protest movement utilised the old religious culture as a means to distance itself from the authoritarian regime.##

The world of the Wayang at Berlin

The Berlin Museum of Ethnology has a large collection of all kinds of *Wayang* puppets from Java and Bali. Most of them originate from the 2nd half of the 19th century. The focus of this article is on the Javanese *Wayang kulit* puppets. They were mainly sold to the museum by two Dutch collectors, Pleyte and Masthoff in the end of the 19th century. No curator so far published the fact that these puppets of the Berlin collection are smaller than the average figures from Java. In quality terms they are less refined than the usual puppets of that time. In fact they are called *wayang kaper*, puppets used for training the *dalang*, the puppet master.

Nevertheless this collection seems to be one of the biggest wayang kaper sets in Western museums. The Balinese puppets, however, and especially the large wayang golek puppet collection, some of them dating back to the middle of the 19th century, are high quality objects. As a joint project, one young Javanese *dalang* came in 2009 to the Berlin Museum of Ethnology to work on the Javanese *wayang kulit* collection. Parts of the *wayang* puppets will be seen in the future in the Humboldt Forum. The last time they were displayed was more than 10 years ago.##

The notion of an all-encompassing cultural expertise from one single representative of a social group has long been out of fashion in anthropological discourse. Considered to be a post-Durkheimian relic in early ethno-science, the omniscient informant might be re-introduced from an unexpected direction: from the study people themselves. In the case of Jong, the members of Kayan society relied on one version of everything considered traditional and historical: the version of this old man. When the ethnographer arrived, he was immediately associated with this expert and the resulting publication is considered to cover ,Kayan culture' for all members of the group. The implications of this on politics of knowledge and the problem of the fixation of one version in time all part of the discussion.##

##With the breakdown of socialism in Eastern Europe in the late 80s and its earlier decline in the wake of Deng Xiaoping's ambitious reforms preparing the People's Republic of China for the global market, images of the past are utilized for power accumulation by various national elites. The comeback of national ideas in postsocialism went along with the replacement of communist dogmas, a radical shift in ideological paradigms and a concurrent re-emergence of ethnicity leading to an increasing ethnicization and confessionalization of the social sphere. These processes not only reinforce existing tendencies of regionalism in multinational states paving the way for administrative-territorial reshuffles and nationalistic-based segregations in peripheral regions. They often also veil the extent to which nativist and post-colonial movements are frequently intertwined in their strife for cultural and political sovereignty.

The paper examines some of these aspects with regard to Krasnodar in Southern Russia, a region neighbouring Abkhazia, the second case study, representing one of the two renegade entities that declared independence from Georgia after the South Ossetia War in August 2008. Moldova being still a member of the CIS, as Georgia was before the war, is finally discussed concerning the Transnistrian conflict. Showing different path dependencies, these regional conflicts present transformation courses with similar results: Consensus making among ethnically divergent groups is accompanied by cultural delimitation that confronts the 'own' with the 'other'. Historical and social memories are employed in this process as tools for an 'otherization' profiled identity building, as are language, faith and other cultural markers. Violence is used in this context as a catalyst to push the development, triggering incalculable dynamics that lead to further escalation. Ethnic cleansing in Georgia and Moldova, in Azerbaijan and Armenia, in Lhasa, Urumchi, and recently in Osh gives proof to the suitability of this mechanism that cut off century old socio-cultural ties within few days.##

Urban Governance of Economic Upgrading Processes in China: The Case of Guangzhou Science City

##Facing intense inter-city competition, urban development strategies in China's metropolises require constant adaptation. This change is particularly enforced in the mega-urban region of the Pearl River Delta (PRD) which for a long time has been known as the world's factory. The main argument of this paper is that advancement along the value chain and the implementation of industrial upgrading processes require new institutional arrangements. The inclusion of the EPR principle and the role of stakeholders in formulating the draft rules are both positive developments that are essential to address the e-waste problem successfully. ##Isaan, Thailand's northeastern region, has traditionally been marginalized and its Lao-speaking population still faces discrimination. But its regional culinary traditions have recently captivated all classes of Bangkok's food-conscious population. This article attempts to map the complexities of the nation's acceptance and the spread of Isaan's regional cuisine. Over the past 20 years a few Isaan dishes have been appropriated and adopted to Thai tastes. This culinary "Thai-ization" has "deethnicized" and "de-regionalized" some local foods. These co-opted dishes are already considered to be part of the emergent national cuisine of Thailand. While some dishes have been accepted, others are still discriminated against, especially *plaaraa*, a non-pasteurized fish sauce, and the Carpaccio version of Isaan's iconic dish *laap*, a raw spicy minced meat or fish salad. Traditionally these types of dishes were rejected on cultural grounds but today national campaigns against certain Isaan foods are debated in terms of "health concerns", while serving the goals of national political integration. The people of Isaan react by developing a culture of resistance, turning some raw dishes into markers of regional identity. These local strategies are supported by global culinary trends (Sushi!) making Isaan food irresistible even in Bangkok's haute cuisine.##

Christianism in East Sumba. The appropriation of a world religion in Indonesia from the perspective of the theory of practice

The Christian religion has become a global phenomenon and presently shows its major dynamic in Africa, Latin America, and Asia. Türk presents a multi-faceted image of a local manifestation of this religion in Sumba, taking five practices (worship, home meetings, mission, burial, marriage) to explain how Christian belief becomes part of everyday life, and thus from something alien to the familiar, or own. Appropriating this world religion (or being converted) follows a "logic of practice" for which Türk utilizes Bourdieu. In this ethnographic context, the following Protestant groups are concerned: 1) Nederlandsche Gereformeerde Zendingsvereeniging, in the 18th and 19th centuries; 2) the Gereja Kristen Sumba after the foundation of independent Indonesia in 1945; but there are Pentecostal groups active as well: Jemaat Pentakoste, or Kemaah Injil.

Institutional autism. The ASEAN and the Thai-Cambodian border conflict ##Southeast Asia ushered in a new era with the adoption of the ASEAN Charter in 2007 which entered into force a year later. At a time when ASEAN is transforming itself into a legal entity, unprecedented skirmishes broke out between two of its members on the border of Thailand and Cambodia. The background of this confrontation is an old dispute linked to the ancient Preah Vihear temple. The International Court of Justice ruled in 1962 that the ruins belong to Cambodia but made no decision concerning the adjacent land. To this day, Bangkok and Phnom Penh are making competing claims over this 4.6 km² piece of land close to the border. The situation escalated when the Preah Vihear temple was designated a world Heritage Site in July 2008, following Cambodia's application to UNESCO. The upshot: several gun fights between October 2008 and June 2010 with at least eight soldiers killed. The contrast could not have heen greater: officially proclaimed institutional change and the

use of military force by two member states. The conflict says a lot about Cambodian and Thai foreign policy. But above all it allows conclusions to be drawn about the process of regional integration in Southeast Asia. There can be no doubt that the gap between rhetoric and reality is widening. From a medical viewpoint, the patient, in this case ASEAN, can be described as suffering from "institutional autism".##

##As a consequence of the politicization of religion in India, the study of Islam in fertility is a highly sensitive issue. How do Muslim women make decisions relating to their fertility and practice of contraception? How do factors [such] as socio-cultural norms, socioeconomic constraints, national family planning policies, and Islamic legal tenants affect women's reproductive health behavior? This ethnographic study answers these questions by analyzing the local context, in which the lives of these lowincome Muslim women are embedded. Theories and concepts of demography are also explored and critically reflected on.## This study, based on fieldwork in the Hazrat Nizamuddin Basti of New Delhi in 2007-8, explores choices, behavior and attitudes of women there, with regard to reproduction. So, women's agency is described, the context and infrastructure of the Basti is portrayed as well as the context of marriage, fertility, reproduction, lifestyle, etc. In this context values, women's health, contraception, abortion is studied on the basis of participant observation. The last chapter deals with these questions in the light of the Qu'ran and Islam in general. Among other findings, the study shows that fertility of these Muslim women is not higher than that of their Hindu neighbors, and that decisions clearly depend on general socio-economic situations they live in.

Several attempts since the mid-seventies to ease the tensions have ended in deadlock, the latest being the thwarted signing of the so-called Memorandum of Agreement on Ancestral Domain (MoA-AD) in August 2008. This paper tries to explain the length of the conflict and its salient features. In particular, it deals with the interests pursued by the main protagonists and the factors leading to recurring internal frictions and divisions within the ranks of organized Moro resistance. It also sheds light on the prospects for the numerous NGOs and observers of the International Monitoring Team (IMT) stationed in the southern Philippines to ensure permanent peace in the region and to forge closer political as well as economic ties with neighboring Malaysia and Indonesia.##

##The occurrence of Pleistocene rock art in Australia is reviewed against the background of historical developments in the age estimation of rock art. Despite errors in interpreting data and the continuing paucity of credibly dated examples, it is apparent that most rock art of the earliest phase has survived as petroglyphs, which is consistent with the rest of the world. The author estimates that a large proportion of Australian petroglyphs are of the Pleistocene, and he points out that this corpus relates exclusively to Mode 3 (Middle Palaeolithic) technological traditions. It therefore follows that, contrary to conventional notions, which see palaeoart traditions commencing with the Aurignacian, there is actually far more surviving "Middle Palaeolithic" rock art in the world than there is "Upper Palaeolithic." The formal semantic analysis of kinship terms was an important early focus of cognitive anthropology; as complex, systematic and shared realms of meaning, such terminologies were seen as paradigmatically cultural. Later, textual and agency-centred models became more popular than the formal semantic approaches. My analysis of changes to Wampar terms in the face of transformed relations between cultures is relevant to those interested in the connections between cognitive models and cultural practice. The focus is the analysis of everyday phenomena, and the author wants to show the (non-)appropriation of the "alien Europe" in the difference between the original texts and translations, such as the process of "Bulgarization" of the young Bulgarian nation. This is of particular interest if one considers present processes of normalization and standardization in the European Union. So the comparison of original and translation is a study in cultural relations, or possible cultural relations, given that drama and theater are models of the reality of the respective cultures. Results show that the most remarkable deviations of translations from the original concern religious content, certain family and gender relations, differentiation of social strata, and positively vs. negatively depicted state institutions.

In the late 1980s and early 1990s a new social movement - the local exchange trading systems (LETS) - reached Germany. This initially Canadian movement draws attention to societal and economic failures of the monetized economy and attempts to resolve them on a local level. By introducing alternative local currency systems the exchange networks movement tries to promote a sustainable and local economy and aims at improving the living conditions of underprivileged people. Whereas founding activities were initially slow to emerge, a boom occurred in the mid 1990s. Our research describes the patterns of diffusion in German counties (Landkreise and kreisfreie Städte). In order to explain the diffusion process, we employ concepts of spatial proximity, the impact of national print media, and general socio-cultural fit. Finally, we analyze the effects of differently defined population densities on founding rates. Using data for the period from 1988 to 2005, we are able to confirm that social contagion and national print media are of considerable importance for the growth of these exchange systems. Furthermore, the roles of socio-cultural factors and of ecological assumptions are supported as well. In East Germany, diffusion takes place very slowly. We discuss this result with respect to the comparative lack of ideological resources.##

Following the delineation of official indicators of competence (inclusion criteria) within an appointment procedure, it can be shown that a broad distribution of institutions and persons that meet these criteria exists. The empirical examination of the actually successful occupations shows that closure mechanisms play a role because the successful candidates stem from no more than 10 out of 34 clinical departments. The monetary capital in terms of third-party funds is the most important allocation criterion, but cannot sufficiently explain the way appointments take place. As there are candidates who in formal terms are in a wide measure equally qualifled, and a consequential uncertainty of the basis of decision within an appointment procedure, the derivation of the candidate in terms of a personal relationship to a chair holder (department head) from whose clinic he applies and who acts as a patron, proves to be the decisive distinction following the examination of all inclusion criteria. This results in a reproduction of the chair holders (department heads) largely from the same clinical departments and the formation of an academic caste system. In perspective, this cartel-like closure appears to be getting increasingly worse.##

As the beginning and continuation of a relationship is based on consensual decisions of both partners to interact, we concentrate on the question if and how potential partners indeed reply to contact offers. Data from online dating platforms therefore offer a unique opportunity for sociologists to study how partnerships are initiated and how they develop over time. This contribution provides four important empirical results: Firstly, it demonstrates that only 20% of all first contact offers are answered. This is a surprisingly small proportion. Secondly, it supports the hypothesis of homophily. According to this hypothesis, people with similar education, age and physical attractiveness should prefer each other and thus are more likely to form couples. Third, it shows that women still have severe problems to reply to contact offers from lower educated men, while men are already less reluctant to reply to higher educated women. Thus, the rarity of couples where women are higher educated than their partners are to a large proportion the consequence of women's preferences rather than men's preferences. Finally, our study does not find any support for the trade-off hypothesis, indicating that women do not exchange their physical attractiveness for men's educational resources, and vice versa.##
